

## **FAQ**

### **Should I bring bedding?**

The grand suite has all the bedding you need. The other cabins and motel's have beds, but you need to bring your own sheets/pillows/etc.

### **How do I cook my food?**

If camping or in a log-cabin/motel, the site has fire-pits so that you can put those boy-scout skills to good use. If you're in the grand-suite or your buddy is in the grand suite, you can use the gas grill on the deck of the suite or the oven in the suite. If you don't know how to survive without your mom or wife, its ok to bring ham-sandwiches and breakfast bars- it's only 2 meals.

### **What time Should I arrive?**
